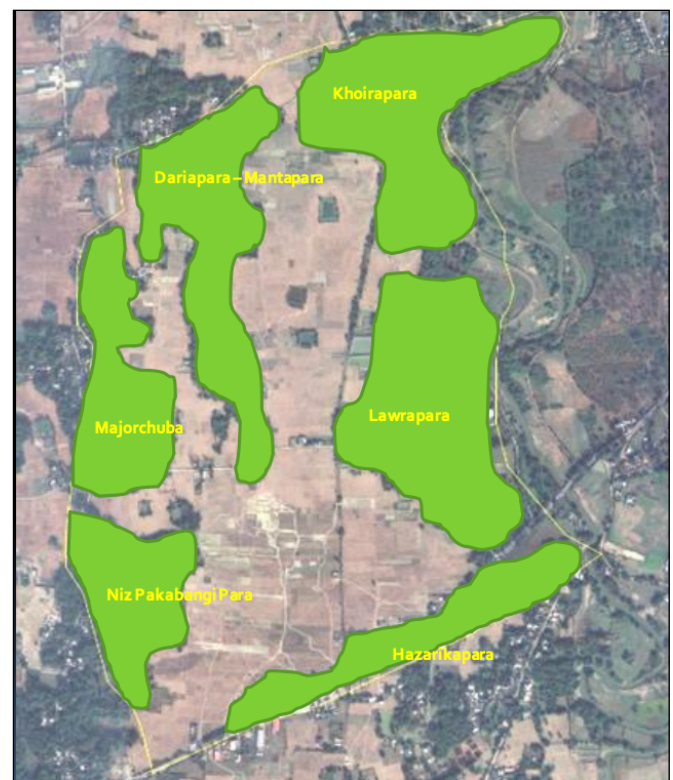


Detailed Report presentation on the pilot survey at adopted village

A presentation of the report on the pilot survey conducted at the adopted Pakabangipara village was organised by Mangaldai College Teachers Unit (MCTU) at Department of Geography on 7th June 2022. 
A meeting on the Village Adoption was held on Department of Geography and certain resolutions are taken:

RESOLUTIONS:

1. The meeting on village adoption held on 07/06/2022 has whole heartedly appreciated and accepted the Pilot survey of Pakabangipara village undertaken by some members of the committee on 01/06/2022. The Principal of Mangaldai College, Dr. K.K. Borah and IQAC Co-ordinator, Dr. Santosh Borkakati has also shown their interest and support in the village adoption works. A brief presentation on the present status and the future prospects of the village was outlined by the convenor of the Village Adoption Committee (VAC), Dr. Pranjit Kumar Sarma.
2. Today meeting took the resolution to organise a general meeting of all the faculty members of the college along with some representatives from the village for discussing the action plan in the adopted village.
3. The IQAC Co-ordinator, Dr. Santosh Borkakati suggested that the consent of the villagers should be taken before starting any kind of programme in the village premises and he also suggested that a socio-economic census survey of the village must be taken prior to the activities of village adoption so that the before and after scenario can be compared annually.
4. The meeting took the resolution of putting a permanent hoarding citing "ADOPTED VILLAGE OF MANGALDAI COLLEGE". A resolution of making the school of the village a model village was also taken. The meeting also agreed in the matter of signing MoUs with significant players from finance, administration, health and educational field for the upliftment of the village.
5. The Principal of Mangaldai College suggested that the college fraternity should work out of the box. The working hours must be stretched for undertaking of the extension services. He also suggested that observing the significant days and other extension activities should be continued in the adopted village. He proposed of giving certain employment opportunities to the Self- Help Groups like weaving of 'Gamosa' with a logo of Mangaldai College that will be used in the college functions for valedictions and so on. Similarly, a few villagers will be trained for the preparation of vermi-compost and encourage them for Organic Farming.
