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Definitions of School

- Derived from Greek term 'Skhole' which means leisure or a scholarly discussion held in spare time.
- Schools are places of formal instruction.

• School is a special environment, where a certain quality of life and certain types of activities and occupations are provided with the object of securing the child's development along desirable lines. (JOHN DEWEY)

Schools are institutions devised by civilized man for the purpose of aiding in the preparation of the young for well adjusted and efficient membership of society.

Characteristics of School

- Schools honours to a body of rules and regulations.

- There are fixed method of teaching like lecture, demonstration, experimentation, projects, discussion etc. in school education.
